Types of CSR Activities



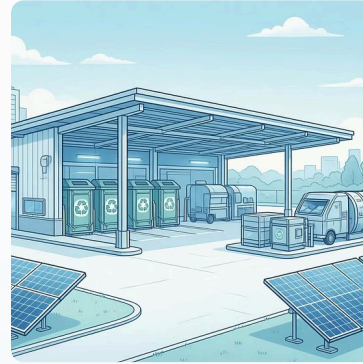
Philanthropy
